We all know that space is the final frontier and, when it comes to kitchens, this is especially true. Having enough room to manoeuvre and cook up a feast in any kitchen is vitally important — without ample room, the simple act of preparing dinner can become a real hassle.

But with so many of us living in smaller spaces in big cities, space inside our homes is often at a premium. This was the challenge that confronted the team from Attard's Cabinetry when they were called in to design and build a new kitchen for this inner-city terrace house.

Though it only occupies a small area of the house, this gorgeous kitchen still has plenty of storage. The pantry boasts internal drawers and the top cabinets are cut around the plumbing

stack and bulkhead to make use of every available inch of space.

There are no handles to the top cabinets so as not to close in the area and lights are mounted on the underside of these cabinets. As a result, the kitchen feels open and inviting, with heaps of room for a couple of people to move around without banging their heads or running into each other.

And while this area is now incredibly practical, style has not been sacrificed. The use of bright green creates a warm atmosphere and complements the classy quartz benchtop flecked with colour. It's funky without going over the top and perfectly suits this inner-city terrace.
